Treasured Memories of West Chester

At The Hickman, we always say, "When you're here, you're home." That's especially true for the many Hickman residents who moved here from within the Borough of West Chester. Whether they were born in West Chester, moved here with their families as children, or chose this community as adults, their presence at The Hickman now is a further enrichment of their—and our—deep roots in this community.

Shirley Shoffner, for example, raised her family in the oldest block of homes still standing in West

Chester, Simon Barnard Row, which was built in 1856 to house manufacturing laborers. She loved both the history of her home and its convenient location between downtown and The Hickman. She could take the

Red Arrow Line (trolley) along West Chester Pike into Philadelphia for shopping, or she could just walk over to West Chester's vibrant mid-century downtown, full of national and independent retail stores.

Shirley's location also enabled her to serve her community in many ways. She was a wonderful neighbor to The Hickman, bringing her children along to walk the halls and attend to resident requests. She was always busy on Election Day, driving residents to the polls or working in the precinct.

She also got involved in the preservation of West Chester's history and quality of life as the President of the North Central Neighborhood Association, serving on the University Area Neighborhood Task Force and the planning commission that developed the West Chester Comprehensive Plan. In that capacity, her support of the overpass that connects the Mary Taylor House to the Hickman building was crucial to its construction.

Blondie Morrell also has a long history in and around West Chester. She grew up overlooking Graystone Hall and the Sharpless/Jerrehian property, and her father was a plumber for the local mushroom cannery at High Street and Greenhill Road. Families from the neighborhood and the borough would walk to Sharpless Lake for fishing and swimming, and the fields and woods served as walking paths and playgrounds for Blondie, her siblings and her neighbors.

For 127 years, no resident has had to leave The Hickman due to a financial situation.

Blondie attended West Chester High School, located at North Church and Lafayette Streets, a block from The Hickman. She and her brothers walked the 3 miles to and from school each day. After completing high school, she worked for an insurance company on High Street, then became a comptometer operator. Upon her marriage, she was able to buy some of the farmland near her childhood home, where she lived for the next 60 years. Her son grew up to become the borough's arborist—he knew every tree in West Chester.

Caroline Thomas is also a lifelong resident of the area. Her family farmed mushrooms and other products. She attended West Chester borough schools-- her junior high is now the Washington Square Apartments-- and she was a member of the last class to graduate from the borough's high school before it burned down. After graduation, she worked at Wyeth Labs, which manufactured penicillin and other pharmaceuticals in the borough from 1944-2004.

Caroline married into a West Chester institution—the *Daily Local News*. Her husband's great-grandfather, William Hodgson, founded

its predecessor, *The Jeffersonian*, in 1855. After the war, the name was changed, but the offices remained at 12 North High Street from 1855 until 1970 as it expanded to serve the



whole county. Caroline's husband's family retained ownership of the paper until 1990, and still treasures bound volumes from as far back as the 1880s.

Like many others, these three residents have been part of West Chester's change and growth for many years. By choosing The Hickman, they are still home.
